The last month has had remarkable progress at finding more Series Is. We are still at the stage of reaching out to clubs and finding more trucks. This growth will tail off in the coming months. Since the last update we have seen the following additions:

80": 53 88": 27 107" Reg: 6 107" SW: 13 88": 18 109" Reg: 10 Other: (2)

93 more chassis numbers were added to the database which let us increase the known US/Canada count by 82 and the non-US/Canada count by 60. Yes 82+60 != 93. Discrepancy comes from reviewing the chassis numbers that we had vs build records. As of the December update we had only done the review for 80". With this update we also included reviews for 107", 109" and 86". 88" is still on the two do list.

As a cautionary note, it is exiting to hear of a 1948 80". We have been in touch with the former owner and that is what it said on the title. We do not have a chassis number. However it was imported circa 1960 and people were not as precise with titles at that time. The one photo that we have reviewed shows an inverted T grill and the head lights are more like the peak through or later (after mid 1950). This truck was sold in the late 1970s had has not been spotted since the early 1980s, so it is being tracked as a 1948 until proven otherwise with these known caveats.

At this time NASOR is not issuing an opinion as to how many of these Land-Rovers are currently operational nor issuing any location data.
