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There are currently 627 known and rumored Series One Land-Rovers in Canada or the United States. This reflects a net add of 26 since the last update No. 5 on 1 October 2015.

A new year and a new update on this project. Since the last update we have net added 26 more Land-Rovers:

9 more chassis numbers were added to the database which let us increase the known number of US/Canada original trucks by 4.

The NASOR site now has an updated version of the article on North American 80" that was first printed in the Ottawa Valley Land-Rovers December 2012 newsletter. That research has determined that 1,348 80" were imported between 1948 and 1953. So far we know that there are at least 70 survivors and up to 97 additional survivors. This means a currently known survival rate of 5.2% to 12.4% for North American 80". We are working on similar numbers for the 86", 88", 107" and 109" Series Is. The more chassis numbers that we can learn, the better that we can match up known survivors.

As a cautionary note, as per the January update we have on 1948 80" listed. The person who owned in the 1970s claims that it is a 1948, but grainy period photos point more towards a 1952 or 1953. However in that era updating parts for newer specs (*e.g.*, lights-behind-grill, to inverted T grill) happened from time to time.

We look forward in 2016 to tracking down various rumors and getting confirmations on more trucks.
